WEBINAR DETAILS

This workshop will provide an overview of how framing strategies can increase support for effective policies that address maternal addiction. We will discuss dominant patterns in public thinking in America based upon research by the Frameworks Institute. Listening to interviews with the public about this topic will identify strongly held beliefs about substance use during pregnancy and when parenting. We will then discuss framing strategies that increase collective thinking and problem solving. By the end of the workshop, attendees will have basic knowledge of how to use framing to discuss their own research and policy-related work.



ABOUT THE PRESENTER



Dr. Amanda Van Scoyoc is a practicing clinical psychologist and a Community Faculty Member at Yale Child Study Center. Her research aims to set the foundation for optimal child well-being and ultimately a healthy society by identifying how to best support children and families impacted by addiction and violence. Dr. Van Scoyoc is particularly interested in interview-based research that focuses on the experiences of women with addictions as well as the public's perception of this population. In her therapeutic practice, she specializes in working with children who are impacted by violent trauma. She completed her Ph.D. at the University of Oregon under the mentorship of Dr. Phil Fisher and completed additional training at Yale Child Study Center.

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
